Objectives and activities	es			
Charitable purposes	Pass IT On collects donated computer equipment, adapts it and gives it to people with disabilities who live within the EH (Edinburgh) postcode area.			
Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects	Pass IT On receives donations of used computer equipment from individuals and companies throughout the Edinburgh area. Staff, volunteers and work placement trainees securely remove all data and refurbish the computers.			
	People whose disabilities make it difficult or impossible to use publicly available IT can register with Pass IT On.			
	Clients fill out a questionnaire about the difficulties they might have using a computer and tell us about any previous computer experience. Pass IT On then visit the client in the place where they will use their computer to carry out an informal assessment – finding out what they want to use their computer for and what (if any) adaptations they will need. An assessment report details any costs involved. If a client can't afford to pay for any adaptations, they can apply to our Adaptation Fund for help.			
	A refurbished computer is then prepared for the client - required adaptations are bought, relevant software installed and the system is tested for electrical safety. Then the computer system is installed for the client, their internet connection set up if required, and they receive a brief introduction into how to use the computer. If appropriate they are referred on to training agencies. Pass IT On offers clients a follow-up visit to iron out any teething problems.			
Achievements and performance				
Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period	Pass IT On continued to meet its prime purpose of providing people with disabilities with refurbished computers during 2015. 44 new clients were registered with Pass IT On; 36 clients were given a comprehensive assessment of their ICT needs and 41 disabled people were provided with a computer, set up for use in their own homes. Follow-up support was provided on 264 occasions, usually by phone, or email, but occasionally by an additional visit to a client's home.

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	encourage digital participation, particularly with regard to improving the quality of life of people with disabilities.
	During 2015, the core team of volunteers and work placement trainees gave a total of 1,334 hours of their time to Pass IT On.

Financial Situation	Pass IT On continued to have relative financial security with a grant of £55,000 from the Scottish Government in 2015. Further income came primarily from Community Scotland and from the sale of surplus equipment.
Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves	Our policy is that a three months average unrestricted expenditure should be held in the general reserve fund. We achieved this target at the year end.

Notes to the accounts forming part of the financial statements for the year to 31st December 2015

Note 1:

Accounting Policies

Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Depreciation Policy

All fixed assets are fully depreciated. The organisation's policy is not to capitalise expenditure under £2,000. Otherwise fixed assets are written off over their useful lives on the following basis;

IT and other electronic equipment

Resources expended

All expenditure is included on an accruals basis and is recognised when there is a legal or constructive obligation to pay for expenditure. The charity is not registered for VAT and accordingly expenditure is shown gross of irrecoverable VAT and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Pension costs

The Organisation operates a defined contribution pension scheme open to all employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the Organisation in an independently administered fund. The amount of pension costs in the accounts represents the contribution due by the Organisation to the scheme in respect of the financial year and a provision for underpayment in previous years. The pension costs charge represents contributions payable by the Organisation net of the employees' contribution and amounts to £7,455 (2014: £1,800).
