Newsgroups

- 1. A **newsgroup** is a way of discussing topics on the web or by email. An example is Google Groups You just sign up to them.
- 2. A **newsgroup** is a public discussion forum. It can be a way of **posting** a comment or a question and hoping that someone, somewhere, will also want to comment or be able to answer the question. They are different to **message boards** in that they are not restricted to a particular website.
- 3. **Newsgroups** work in much the same way as **chatrooms** or **message boards** and hopefully a **thread** will develop in answer to your comment or question. They are not related to "News" in the normal sense.
- 4. Most Internet Service Providers will have a **newsgroup** to which you can subscribe. To read **newsgroups** you use special programs called newsreaders. Some email programs like Outlook Express let you access newsreaders. Sites such as Google Groups allow you to look without a newsreader.
- 5. Most **newsgroups** are related to a specific topic.
- 6. There are over a hundred thousand **newsgroups**, or **groups** for short, and many of them can be tracked using Usenet. Usenet is a world-wide distributed discussion system which gives access to different **newsgroups**.
- 7. **Newsgroups** are arranged into a hierarchy format e.g. alt.support.diet.low-fat where the first alt. means it

could be about anything and then it is broken down further so you can find your own topic of interest.

Other examples are

rec. - recreation (games and hobbies)

soc. - social and cultural
