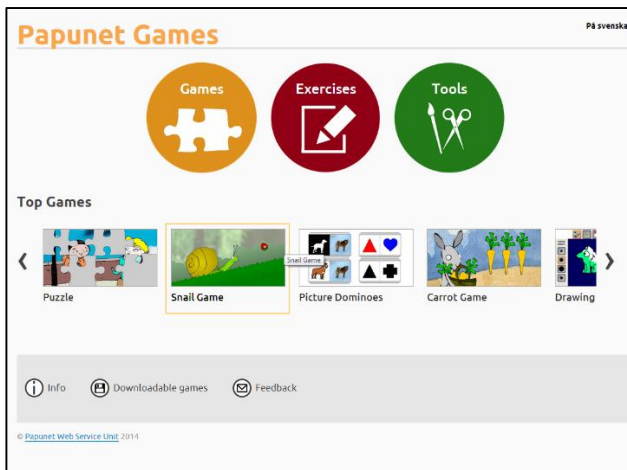

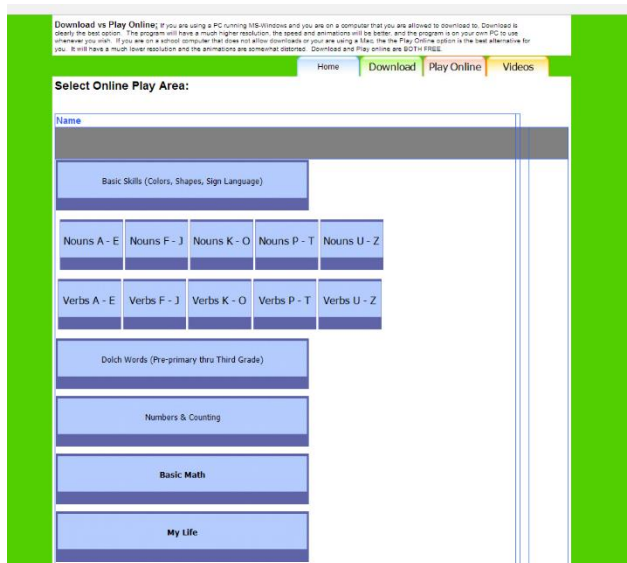


Papunet Games www.papunet.net/games/

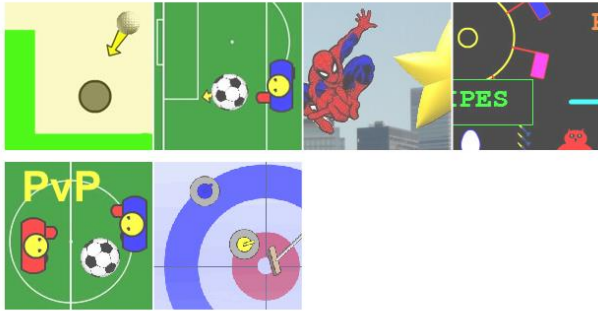

A website developed by the mum of 2 boys who both showed an interest in the computer, but didn't know how to use the mouse or keyboard. These educational games can be used simply by pressing the spacebar.

The programs are based on high interest subjects, such as nursery rhymes, holidays, and birthday themes. For children with limited language skills, the programs can help give meaning to words and concepts. Holidays, birthdays, going to the doctor, dentist, or getting a haircut, are all broken down into sequential steps to thoroughly explain the event. For children 18 months to 6 years of age (or higher for children with language delays).

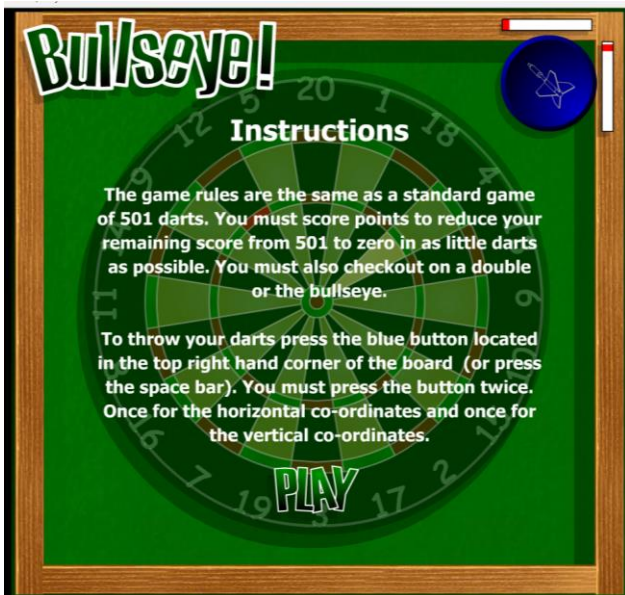

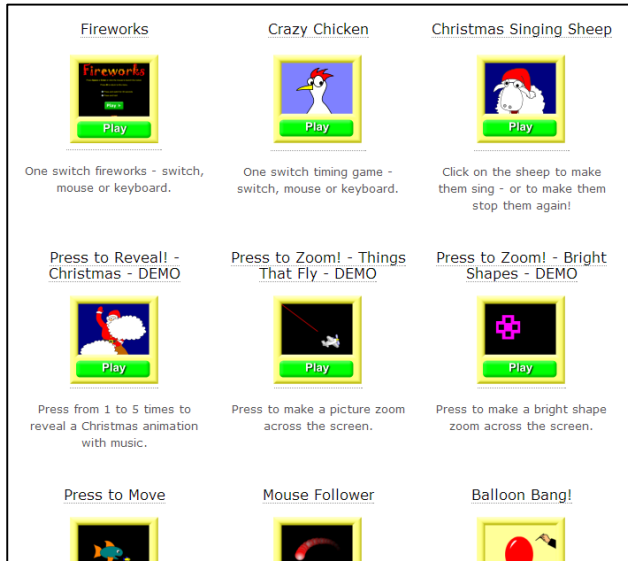

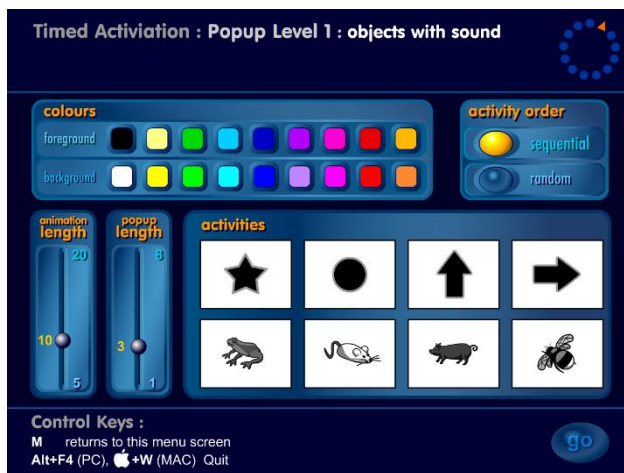
Darts - control with space bar / mouse.

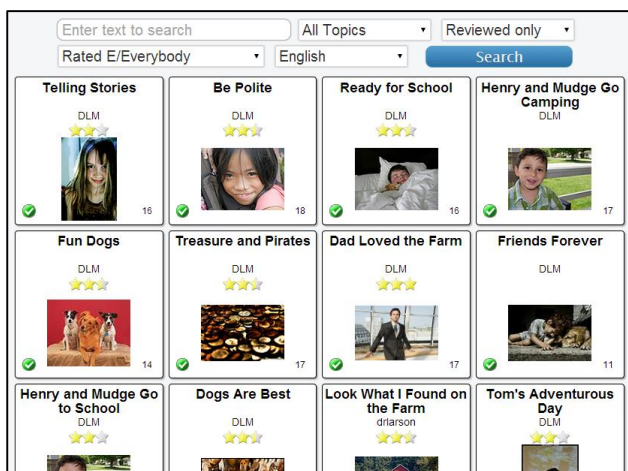


SEN Switcher -
